

COUNCIL MINUTES

July 13, 2022

Moderator Keith Young called the meeting to order at 7pm. Members present were Amy Cosgrove, Edgar Goodale, Andrea Hanulec, Ann Priapi, Kathy Stapon, Liz Wines, Rev. Anton DeWet and Keith Young. Rev. Anton led us in prayer. The minutes of the June 8th meeting were published in the last newsletter. Edgar made a motion to accept them with no additions or corrections and Amy seconded it.



TREASURER'S REPORT

Edgar Goodale reported that the June performance of the endowment was the worst he has seen since becoming treasurer. He explained that the bonds we own go down in value when interest rates go up. Eventually we will collect their full amount at maturity. He also said that the equities in the endowment are all conservative and their value has dropped only a little. Despite this news, the church is financially stable. As of June 30, we have taken in a little more than half of our budgeted pledges.

PASTOR'S REPORT

Rev. Anton brought a memorial plaque that Lisa Drozd made. He asked Andrea if Robert would be able to hang it in the sanctuary next to the Ralph Fanning painting in the southwest corner.

Around the exterior of the church there are some things that need attention. The handicap parking signs on the fence have gotten mildewed, the memorial garden has been taken over by weeds, the driveway chain is heavy, rusted and should be replaced with a brightly colored plastic one, the posts it is attached to are leaning over and the warning sign that hangs from it needs to be replaced.

At the parsonage, a person recently came to check the sprinklers that are leaking but they have yet to come back to do the repairs. There are some large dead branches hanging over into the neighbor's yard on the south side that need to be cut and removed. Anton is concerned because if they fall, they will break the fence below or injure kids playing on the other side. Keith will contact Rick about the sprinkler and tree work.

Anton will be taking off 8/3-8/10. He will see if he can find a supply pastor then let Kathy and Edgar know who it will be.

He expressed his concern that Keith has taken on too many responsibilities connected to the church and risks getting burned out. We should work to form a search committee and turn those tasks over to it. Finally Anton suggested that we include an item in each newsletter about progress with the search for a new pastor.

MINISTRY REPORTS

Buildings and Grounds

Keith will contact Rick Reeve about the issues described in the Pastor's Report.

Edgar told us that the repair work to the steeple is finally complete down to the roof line of the building. Now we need to get estimates on a new roof, fascias, and exterior painting. He said it would be wise to have this information by the end of 2022 so that we can make plans on how to finance and schedule the work. He will speak with Kevin, his son, to get this started.

The repair work on the wall in Luce Hall is put on hold until the fall when worship services move back into the sanctuary.

Outreach

Andrea Hanulec updated the council on the school supply collection. The 48 backpacks she ordered cost about \$200.00. Donations of cash to date are \$300.00. We will continue to collect donations of supplies or money until the end of July. The backpacks will be filled the first week of August and delivered to Roanoke Avenue School. She had a flier from a company that sells backpacks already filled with supplies and will tuck it away for next year.

The food pantry at St. John's is doing a little better this month. Staff there have requested donations of fresh fruits and vegetables. Liz Wines said that she will cut and donate lettuce from her farm anytime Andrea wants to come up and get it.

In August we will collect for OCWM again. To date we have collected \$1366 of \$3500 budgeted.

Worship

Kathy Stapon and Andrea have found potential substitute organists. There are three; John Eyre, Lois Ross and Teddy Turpin.

Attendance at Sunday worship services in Luce Hall has been good. Anton said that he only has heard from two people who felt it was too early. In August we'll decide when to change back to 10am worship in the sanctuary.

This Sunday's service (7/17/22 at 9am) will be outside on the lawn at the parsonage. Anton asked for volunteers to come a few minutes early to bring chairs over from the church.

Anton brought up whether or not he should continue making and posting online services every Saturday. After some discussion there was no objection to stop them now.



Welcoming / Advertising

Anton said that the tickets for the Chicken Barbecue (7/23/22) have all been sold. He will put up 'Sold Out' signs on the front lawn, ask Gail to cancel the radio ad on WLNG and post a notice on the website.

Amy brought up changing the text in the About Us section of the website. She thinks it is not the best description of our congregation. Anton asked Ann to work on a rewrite and she agreed.

Caring

Liz recently visited with Carol Lee and offered to give her a ride to Sunday services. She has been busy caring for herself, her family and animals on the farm.

SEARCH PROCESS

Keith let us know that he has not gotten much more information from the NYS UCC Conference office. They were to assign us an Associate Conference Minister to help and give advice with the search by the end of June, but that did not happen. It may be decided at a meeting they have scheduled on 7/21/22. He showed a copy of the UCC church profile and the Welcoming and Diversity Survey that our search committee will have to complete. Edgar asked if the committee could use that profile if they decide to advertise the job opening outside of the conference. Keith could not answer the question but will try to find out. We discussed writing a job description for posting on other internet sites.

Finally, we put together a list of names of potential search committee members and decided who would speak to each person.

CONTINUING and NEW BUSINESS

- Chicken Barbecue preparation: Kathy, Andrea, Robert and Ann will meet at 8am on Friday 7/22 to bring supplies down from the attic. We discussed the timing for cooking the corn and potatoes. Amy checked the written instructions that are on file in the church office. Anton reminded us that we need strong people to lift pots and pans in the afternoon. Edgar said that he'll have plenty of muscle outside barbecuing chicken and that he will send some of his crew into the kitchen to help with the heavy lifting if needed.
- We discussed compensating Guy Fein for unused vacation days. Edgar will check his records so that we can come up with a number.
- The downstairs AED is missing, Gail noticed it was gone last month. Anton thought he remembered that it needed parts or repair. Before we buy a replacement, he will send out an email to ask if anyone knows where it is.
- Downstairs classroom rental: Keith has been in contact with Jessica de Vera Wells. Edgar and Rick cleared the playground area in preparation for the classes that Jessica de Vera Wells plans to have on site in the fall. She has signed the rental contract but hasn't provided proof of insurance. Since this is required by the contract, Keith will ask her to get it to us as soon as possible. Jessica asked Keith if she could have sod put down in one corner of the fenced area. After some discussion, we agreed that we will stick to the conditions and limits in the contract. Sod would need topsoil, mowing and consistent water and make additional expenses for the church. Edgar asked for clarification of her intentions. Finally, Keith said he couldn't locate the light switch in the downstairs classroom, he found that the lights needed to be turned on at the electrical panel.
- Time Capsule: Edgar is working on getting it put back in the steeple.
- Membership List: tabled until fall or winter

The Search for Our Next Settled Pastor

Since February, the Council has been working to find our next pastor. In the past, the church has relied on the assistance and expertise of the NYS UCC Conference. Keith Young, our Moderator, has often reached out to their staff by phone and email. The conference recently went through a reorganization that has made it take longer than expected to get responses. Their website lacks resources. As of our last meeting, we are still waiting for them to assign us an Associate Conference Minister whose task will be to help us through the transition. Despite that, we have made progress.

In June, Keith did get to speak with Rev. Gary Ferner, the Associate Conference Minister for Search and Call. With Gary's input, the Council has agreed that it would serve the congregation best to skip finding and hiring an interim pastor. The role of an interim pastor is to help a church repair dysfunction, heal and prepare it for a settled pastor. We believe that Old Steeple is healthy in our spirituality, compassion for others, faith practice and governance. In other words, we are free from major issues or problems that could present obstacles to a new minister. Also at this time, positions for full time ministers in churches with a parsonage get filled faster than interim positions.

So far, the Council has:

- prayed for guidance
- gathered contact information for supply pastors to fill the pulpit on a week by week basis once Rev. Anton leaves
- put together a proposed compensation package for the next minister
- explored other avenues in which to advertise the job opening, that we can use in addition to the NYS UCC Conference
- examined sample profiles from ministers looking for a job (found on the national UCC website)
- discussed the possibility of hiring someone part time to do visitation and calling on friends and members in the time between December 1, 2022 and when the settled pastor begins his or her ministry with us
- reviewed our most recent church profile (2015) and the steps for search and call we used the last time we were in this position
- reviewed the new profile form our conference requires the search committee to complete
- reviewed the 2022 UCC Compensation Guidelines for ministers
- spoken with the Conference about the NYS UCC Welcoming and Diversity Survey; this is a new requirement that will need to be completed as part of the transition process.

Currently we are contacting people about serving on the search committee. Our by-laws require that this committee have at least five who are all members of the Church.

The council appreciates your patience and welcomes your prayerful cooperation and support. We will do our best to keep you informed.
