From 'Canticle of the Sun' by Francis of Assisi (ca. 1181-1226)



On October 4th, the church commemorates Saint Francis of Assisi (ca. 1181-1226), Francis was brought up in what today is Italy as a rich merchant's son. He lived a life of luxury and privilege. However, in his early twenties he began to question his purpose and the meaning of life. After a few years of discernment, he took a vow of poverty (much to the chagrin of his father, who eventually disowned him). In 1208, he felt called to proclaim the gospel. He traveled the countryside with a band of followers, who lived on alms as they preached to peasants in the vernacular – even though they neither had formal training nor

were commissioned by the church to do so. Francis attracted more and more followers and eventually founded the Franciscan brotherhood (some famous members of the Franciscan order are Martin Luther, and Pope Leo XIII).

Francis and his followers were known for their charity and compassion. Francis himself also felt a strong bond with everything created. His 'Canticle of the Sun', see above, is a testament to this. Francis experienced the presence of Christ in the natural world. It is said that he could talk with animals, and that he preached to the birds of the sky. He tenderly called God's works of creation 'brother' and 'sister'. He understood that everything is connected and interdependent, and that human beings are merely a part of God's intricate creation. Not surprisingly, he is the patron saint of animals, creation, and environmentalists in the Roman Catholic tradition. Churches around the world still offer a 'blessing of the animals' on or around the feast day of St. Francis (Old Steeple will do so on Saturday, October 11<sup>th</sup> at 10 a.m.).

In a society where we predominantly see nature as something to be exploited for human 'progress' (with the harrowing consequences of climate change and other manmade natural disasters), may we gain wisdom from Francis and his understanding of creation. It may be time for us to address everything created as tenderly as Francis did: brother rock, sister flower, sister bird, brother tree. It may be time for us to remember that ALL human beings are our siblings. It may be time to acknowledge that God created everything and everyone lovingly – 'and see, it was good' (Genesis 1). To be good stewards of all that God has made and entrusted to us, and to protect it as much as we can. To think about our ways of often mindless consumption, and to look for ways to reduce our footprint on this planet. To honor and praise God – not just with our lips, but through our loving and caring actions as well.

## Outreach





**Neighbors in Need** (NIN) is a special mission offering of the United Church of Christ that supports ministries of justice and compassion throughout the United States. One-third of NIN funds support the Council for American Indian Ministry (CAIM). Two-thirds of this offering is used by the UCC's Justice and Witness Ministries (JWM) to support a variety of justice initiatives, advocacy efforts, and direct service projects through grants. Neighbors in Need grants are awarded to UCC churches and organizations doing justice work in their

communities. These grants fund projects whose work ranges from direct service to community organizing and advocacy to address systemic injustice.

This year's theme is "Carry Each Other's Burdens." The phrase comes from Galatians 6:2, a biblical passage that encourages believers to "Bear one another's burdens, and so fulfill the law of Christ". This means actively supporting each other through struggles, which in turn fulfills the commandment to love one another, as demonstrated by Jesus Christ.

We will begin collecting this offering on October 5, which is World Communion Sunday. The collection will continue throughout the month of October.



## Council Minutes



#### **September 10, 2025**

Moderator Keith started the meeting at 5:30 p.m. and Pastor Kerstin offered a prayer. Members present were Keith Young, Rick Reeve, Pastor Kerstin Weidmann, Edgar Goodale, Ann Priapi, Amy Cosgrove, Barbara Crowley, and Jean Lapinski. The minutes of the July 9<sup>th</sup> meeting were approved as published in the August newsletter, with a motion by Edgar and second by Amy. Note: there was no Council meeting in August.

#### **Pastor's Report - Pastor Kerstin Weidmann**

Pastor Kerstin highlighted several items from her written report. Tim and Ashley Young were married on August 23; and a baptism for the Mlodynia's second child is scheduled for November 9. Pastor Kerstin was invited by the NY Conference to become a facilitator for OWL (Our Whole Lives) for the Suffolk Association in Ithaca on October 2-4. Her expenses will be covered by the NY Conference. She mentioned several ideas for Old Steeple for the upcoming year, and Rev. Bonnie shared a similar list of ideas generated at a Ladies' Luncheon back in April. Pastor Kerstin said that the fall Suffolk Association meeting will be held on November 1 when she will be on vacation, so a delegate from Old Steeple is needed.

#### **Treasurer's Report – Edgar Goodale**

Edgar reviewed August's budget, along with the year-to-date budget, with the Council. The endowment fund did well again last month, increasing in value by \$30,000. We are on target with expected income, and expenses were also as expected, with the exception of "Repairs and Maintenance" which was higher because of the installation of the new ramp. Pledges and outreach contributions remain on target for the year.

#### **MINISTRY REPORTS**

#### **Buildings and Grounds – Rick Reeve**

Rick said that minor repairs were made, along with fixing the downstairs toilet. He reported that a former Old Steeple scholarship winner, Juliana Hise, is presently doing research and teaching at Stony Brook University and has been accepted into medical school next August! Her brother James, a 2024-25 Old Steeple scholarship winner, is attending Stony Brook and working part-time. Keith will speak with our sexton to reinforce the need for timely communication.

#### **Worship – Ann Priapi**

Chris Magyar will substitute for Anyi on September 14 when she will be away. Ann will be away on September 14 and 28 as well as a few weeks in October and/or November, and she will develop a list of Sunday worship activities that she routinely handles that can be shared with her substitutes. Gail will develop a flyer for the Blessing of the Animals service on October 11 and Ann and her team will distribute the flyers. There will be no Farmers' Services this fall, and Gail will put a note in the newsletter. Ann reminded us that cell phones should be silenced during worship.

#### **Caring – Barbara Crowley**

Barbara has made visits and calls to members who are homebound or limited in mobility.

#### **Spiritual Formation**

The Council sadly accepted Rev. Bonnie's resignation from Council, with much gratitude for all the initiatives that she has spearheaded throughout the years. She offered to advise members of both Spiritual Formation and Outreach, which presently do not have leaders. She will also continue to order groceries for the food pantry, which Nancy Goodale picks up and delivers each week.

A Sunday School Kick-Off will be on October 5, followed by a potluck picnic in Luce Hall; with Sunday School classes beginning October 12. Pastor Kerstin will ask Gail to compile a menu for attendees to sign up, and Ann will post the event on our sign. Classes will be held every Sunday except the first Sunday of the month, when children are invited to attend church with their parents. Council decided to hire a part-time teacher through the end of 2025 to take the lead each Sunday, while our volunteers will assist (per our Safe Church policy) as

needed. Gail will develop a flyer, which Ann will share with Suffolk Community College and Pastor Kerstin will share through Handshake. Ann said that curriculum and supplies are readily available for classes.

#### Outreach

September's outreach effort is Habitat for Humanity, October's is Neighbors in Need, November's is Maureen's Haven, and December's is the Christmas Fund and Angel Tree. Victoria Pace will plan for Maureen's Haven again this year and Edgar will speak with her about their needs.

#### **Continuing and New Business**

- Donna Doroszka shared the new quilters rent and agreement with Joy Regula and Nancy Raynor last spring, but they have continued to pay at the existing rate. Keith will follow up, reminding them that the rental rate will increase in January of 2026 and securing a signed agreement.
- Jessica Wells de Vera provided a schedule for this fall's nursery school and requested the use of the kitchen one day a week. Per Council's discussion, Keith will ask Jessica for clarification.
- Edgar reviewed his Proposed 2026
   Budget Overview with the Council,
   explaining each item line by line
   and making the modifications
   agreed on by Council members.
   We are very grateful to Edgar for
   the thorough preparation that he
   does in advance to make the
   process clear and doable.
- A brief discussion of the January 2026 Council vacancies concluded the meeting. According to our bylaws, Council members cannot serve more than two consecutive three-year terms. This means that we'll need a new moderator,




### **Book Discussion Group**
