COUNCIL MINUTES

October 18, 2022 Council Meeting Minutes

Moderator Keith Young called the meeting to order and Rev. Anton led us in prayer. Members present were Amy Cosgrove, Edgar Goodale, Andrea Hanulec, Ann Priapi, Kathy Stapon, Rev. Anton DeWet, Liz Wines and Keith Young. The minutes of the September meeting were published in the last newsletter, Amy made a motion to accept them with no additions or corrections and Kathy seconded it.

TREASURER'S REPORT

Edgar went over the monthly report which reflected the church's finances through 9/30/22. We have continued to run behind on pledges, \$51,411.00 of the \$75,000 budgeted has been collected. The new 2023 budget, approved on 10/16/22, includes \$70,000 for pledges. Edgar let the council know that a new (leased) photocopier for the office will arrive soon and that the per page cost will be substantially lower going forward.

PASTOR'S REPORT

Anton informed us that the pastor and members from First Congregational Church in Riverhead will join us on 11/20/22 for his last worship service. Janet Wright will preach on 11/13, when he and Henza will be packing.

MINISTRY REPORTS Buildings and Grounds

Anton prepared a list of things at the parsonage that will need attention after he and Henza have left. Keith will ask Jessica DeVera Wells to give her schedule of classes to Gail. Dead birds have been found inside the narthex.

Outreach

Andrea advised that for this

month's outreach project, Church World Service, we have taken in \$115. November will be Habitat for Humanity and December the Angel Tree collection of warm things (socks, hats, gloves, scarves, mittens, throws, twin sized blankets). The St. John's food pantry has been receiving more items from our Church, purchased with extra Chicken Barbeque funds, but it is still chronically understocked.

Worship

Kathy told us that Rev. Lorraine DeArmitt, who will be our pastoral supply from 11/27/22 to 1/29/23, has requested a letter of agreement that spells out terms and responsibilities. Anton met with Kathy today and they drafted a preliminary version. Kathy intends to meet with Rev. DeArmitt to go over it. The council gave Kathy authorization to amend the agreement. We had a discussion as to who will be responsible for pastoral care after 11/20. Kathy will look into finding someone to hire on a part time basis for this, until we have hired a settled pastor.

The council decided there will be a Christmas Eve Service at 8 pm. We talked about and agreed that there will not be morning service on Sunday 12/25/22 because the last time Christmas fell on a Sunday, only three people showed up. Gail will be asked to publicize the Christmas Eve Service by taking out an ad in The News Review and put the information about no service Christmas day in the bulletin and newsletter.

Search and Call Basics for Churches in Transition (Part One)

When a congregation discovers that it is about to be in transition, the most important thing they can do at that moment (or shortly thereafter) is to notify the Associate Conference Minister (ACM) serving their Association.

This allows the ACM a chance to gather the necessary resources that will support the congregation through their transition time.

This is especially important if the pastor has given 90 days' notice, which is standard for Call Agreements that meet NY Conference Compensation Guidelines. Once notified, the ACM will work with the congregation's leadership to secure either pulpit supply, a designated pastor, or an intentional interim pastor, depending on the congregation's needs.

When transitional pastoral leadership is secured, the congregation is introduced to the Congregational Welcoming Diversity Inventory, a survey designed to help a congregation identify areas where they welcome diversity, and areas where they may wish to grow in welcoming diversity.

The work done here assists in the building of the congregation's Local Church Profile, which is posted on the United Church of Christ's Opportunities webpage. The only way to post a Local Church Profile is through the ACM.

Search Committees will learn from the ACM how to read a Ministerial Profile, and will begin interviewing candidates who express interest in the position. Very often, there is a lag time between the posting of a Local Church Profile and a congregation receiving Ministerial Profiles.

It is a difficult truth that the larger and more resourced a congregation is, the more Ministerial Profiles they receive.

Even as a congregation waits to see if prospective candidates show interest in their posted Local Church Profile, there are alternatives to pastoral leadership that can be explored.

Identifying local pastors of other denominations is one way. Another is educating and authorizing a member of the congregation for leadership.

Churches in transition may wish to consider partnering with other congregations, nearby UCC congregations, or local congregations of other denominations to share pastoral leadership.
